ANN: 여러분 안녕하십니까? 지금부터 전국 15개 시·도 교육청이 공동으로 주관하는 2011학년도 제 1회 고등학교 3학년 영어듣기능력평가를 시작하겠습니다. 교실에 계시는 선생님들께서는 라디오의 음량을 알맞게 조절해 주시고, 학생 여러분은 답안지에 반, 번호, 그리고 이름을 써넣으시기 바랍니다. 모든 문제는 한 번씩만 들려 드리니, 잘 듣고 지시에 따라 물음에 답하시기 바랍니다.

ANN: 그럼 이제 시작 하겠습니다.

1번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 찾고 있는 가방을 고르세요.

M: Hello, ma'am. May I help you?

W: Hi, I'd like to buy a bag for my 4-year-old daughter.

M: Well, teddy bear bags are the best-sellers these days. Would you like one shaped like a teddy bear face?

W: Hmm, it looks cute, but I prefer square bags.

M: OK. Would you like a bag with a leather strap?

W: Do you only have leather straps?

M: No. We also have bead straps over here.

W: Great. My girl would like a bead strap. And what is that ring hanging on the bag?

M: It's a key chain. Isn't it nice?

W: Yes, but I don't think she will need it. I'll take one without a key chain.

M: OK. Would you like it wrapped?

W: Yes, please. I hope she likes it.

2번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 심경 변화로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: So, you really don't like surprise parties, huh?

M: No, I don't. Why?

W: Well, we were going to do something for you after work, but if you really don't like the idea ...

M: I'd rather not. Birthdays don't really matter to me. Have you already made all the arrangements and everything?

W: We booked the place and invited people, and Danny has already hired a band.

M: Really? Which band?

W: It's a local band — The Beat. They're supposed to be good.

M: You're kidding! The Beat? They're excellent. I really like them.

W: I don't know. If you want, we might be able to cancel it.

M: Well, wait. I like the sound of this surprise party.

W: Yeah? So, should we go ahead with it?

M: Definitely.

3번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계로 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

W: We've talked about your recent work so far. Now let's talk about your childhood. Were there any experiences that affected your current career?

M: I've been drawing since I was about five. I grew up drawing cartoons and watching Bugs Bunny. Also, movies like Star Wars inspired me.

W: Star Wars? I also love that movie myself. Anyway, what do you most enjoy about your job?

M: Creating characters. I bring them to life and convince the audience that the character exists as a living, breathing entity.

W: To bring unanimated things to life is certainly something. But I guess it's sometimes challenging, isn't it?

M: Sure, it is. And entertaining the audience is very difficult. We have to give them something new or surprising instead of an easy solution.

W: Then if you could switch jobs in the movie business what would you do?

M: Since this is purely a hypothetical question, I will admit I actually love writing. I'd love to write screen plays for a living.

W: Now, that is something surprising. I didn't know, and I'm sure our audience didn't know, that you were interested in writing. I'd like to talk with you more, but I'm afraid our time is up. I hope to have you on our show once again soon.

4번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 지불해야 할 금액을 고르세요.

W: Hello. May I help you?

M: Yes, I'm going to tour around the city for 3 days. Can you tell me what type of tickets you have for the waterbus?

W: We have standard, one-day and three-day tickets. The standard is €6, one-day, €18, and three-day, €40. With the forty-euro ticket, you'll see all the highlights of the city on a combined walking-and-boat tour.

M: All right. I'll take two of the three-day tickets.

W: Adult or student?

M: Students.

W: University or high school? Student discounts are different depending on what type of school you go to.

M: We're both university students.

W: Okay. We offer 20% off for university students.

M: That's good. Here's my credit card.

5번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 방문한 목적으로 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

M: Mrs. Wilson, thanks for seeing me on such short notice.

W: No problem, Charles. What can I do for you today?

M: Well, I'm going to apply for an internship next semester to get work experience in my field of study.

W: Good idea. So you may have to cancel your registered classes.

M: That's what I'm worried about. I don't really want to cancel my classes.

W: Well, how about considering a part-time internship? If it's part time, you can balance your school work and your internship. But if you work full time, you know it'll delay your graduation, right?

M: Ahh, I see what you mean. Then I should only take part-time.

W: I think you should make it clear that you're only interested in a part-time position.

M: All right. I'll keep that in mind. Thank you.

6번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 회사에서 하는 일로 언급되지 않은 것을 고르세요.

M: You said your company's slogan is "When you get busy, we get busy for you." Would you please tell me what your company does?

W: We do the simplest errands that a lot of working people have no time for, such as picking the kids up after school, washing their cars, mowing the lawns, and even going grocery shopping.

7번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 가장 먼저 할 일로 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

M: Why the long face? Is something wrong?

M: Why? Tell me what happened.

W: I tried my best to get good grades last semester, so I was sure I would be granted the distinguished student scholarship. But apparently my qualification isn't good enough.

M: Every business owner goes through tough times. But I still envy you.

M: Ha! You must have forgotten how stressful it is to work for someone else.

9번입니다. 다음 그림의 상황에 가장 적절한 대화를 고르세요.
